

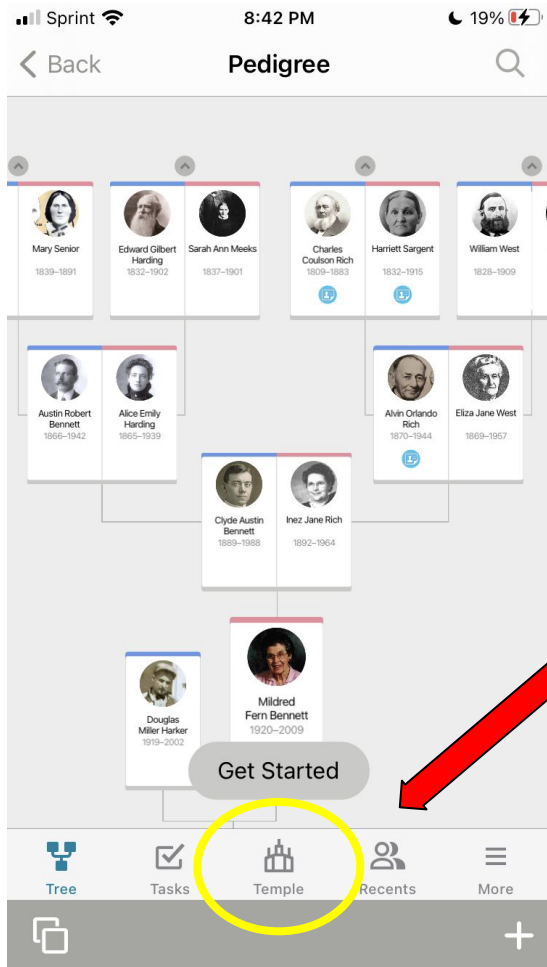

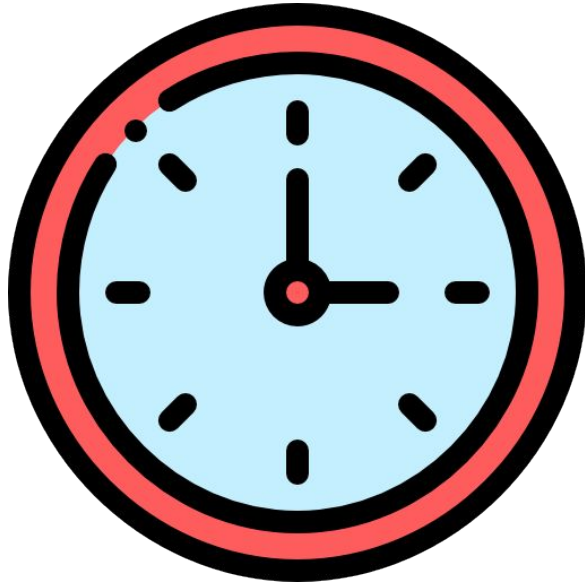
Then choose Ordinances Ready, then View People, and then Continue to get the QR code for the temple to print or choose View Cards to print at home.

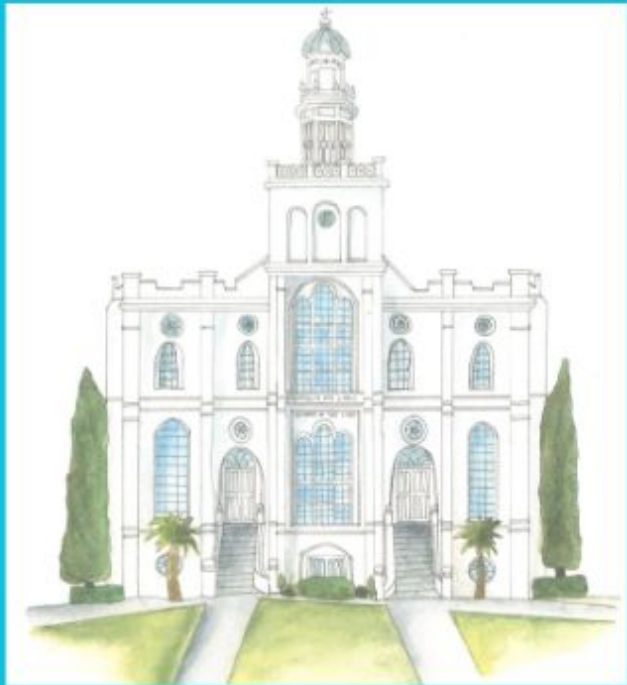

Brief Life History of Alonzo F

When Alonzo F Anderson was born in November 1856, in Harford, Maryland, United States, his father, George Anderson, was 29 and his mother, Mary Elizabeth Keen, was 28. He married Catherine C Abels on 22 April 1879, in Camden, Gloucester, New Jersey, United States. They were the parents of at least 1 daughter. He lived in Aberdeen, Harford, Maryland, United States in 1920 and District 2, Harford, Maryland, United States in 1930. He died on 8 December 1937, in Harford, Maryland, United States, at the age of 81, and was buried in Wesleyan Chapel Cemetery, Aberdeen, Harford, Maryland, United States.

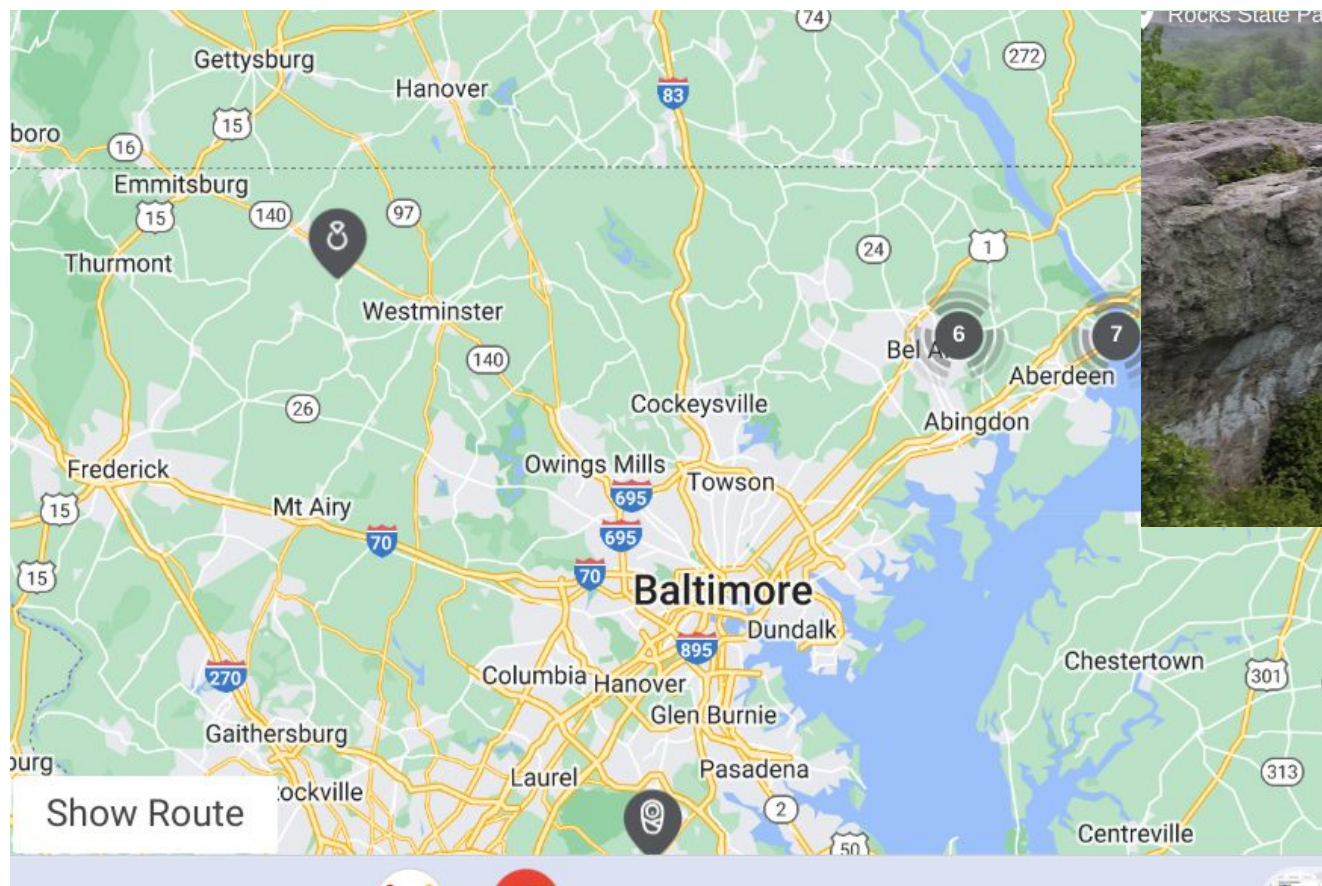

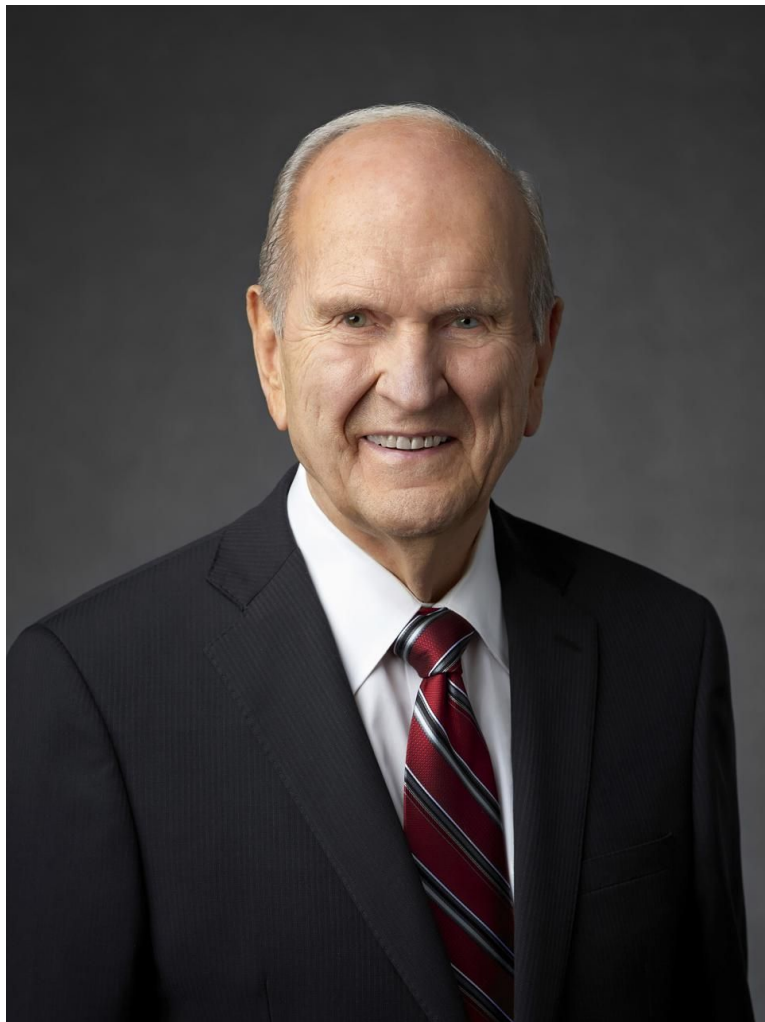
